# From the Mayor

- Can you get out of your house quickly? Would emergency personnel be able to get to you if there was a need? Are the entrances to your home or apartment blocked by debris? It's important to keep the entrances to your front and back porches free from debris and porch furniture. If there's a health emergency or fire, it is vital that the emergency responders get to you quickly. So check those entrances, move debris, chairs, etc.
- It's time to set your clocks back on November 6 and change the batteries in your smoke Detectors, too.
- Schools are open, so please watch for children and also obey the laws regarding school buses. Motorist MUST STOP at least 10 feet away from the bus if red lights are flashing & the stop arm is extended. You MUST STOP when you are behind a bus, meeting the bus or approaching an intersection when the bus is stopped. You MUST STOP if following or traveling alongside a school bus until the red lights have stopped flashing, the stop arm is withdrawn and all children have reached safety. If physical barriers such as grassy medians, guide rails or concrete median barriers separate oncoming traffic from the bus, motorists in the opposing lanes may proceed without stopping. Do not proceed until all the children have reached a place of safety. If you are convicted of violating the laws regarding school buses, you will receive the following: \*60 day driver's license suspension / 5 points on your driving record / \$250 fine

## **M Code Enforcement**

There's still some warm weather left before the snow begins to fall and that means grass will still need to be mowed. Residents are reminded that they are responsible for cutting their lawns as well as the grass and weeds along sidewalks, the street and the alley near their residence.

You may not want to think about it, but snow will be coming. Remember that property owners or tenants are required by ordinance to remove snow and ice from sidewalks within 24 hours from the end of a snowfall and should clear all sidewalks at a width of at least 24 inches. Also, do not push snow back out onto the street once the street has been plowed.


#### Halloween
